## Quick Ways to Prepare for Winter

1. Fix air leaks and inadequate insulation in your attic, which lead to ice dams.
2. Look for damaged or missing shingles that may leak during winter storms. Check and repair breaks in the flashing seals around vent stacks.
3. If gaps between siding and window or door frames are bigger than the width of a nickel, reapply exterior caulk. If they are much larger than a nickel, they may need to be replaced with more energy efficient products.
4. If your gutters are full of leaves, water can back up against your house and damage roofing, siding and wood trim.
5. Add extensions to downspouts so that water runs at least 3 to 4 feet away from the foundation.

## WINTER RECIPE



SWEET POTATO PIE

### INGREDIENTS

- 2 cans of *Farmer's Market Organic Sweet Potato Puree*
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 cups light cream
- 1/2 stick unsalted butter, melted and cooled
- 2 pre-made 9" pie crusts
- Fresh Whipped Cream, for serving (optional, but highly recommended)

### METHOD

- Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- In a medium bowl, whisk eggs. Add the sugar, lemon zest, cinnamon, allspice, nutmeg, and salt. Make sure they are well combined. Whisk the cream into the mixture.
- Add the two cans of sweet potato puree to the mixture and whisk until thoroughly combined. Add the melted butter and continue to mix until well combined.
- Grab your two pie crusts (make sure they are defrosted). The mixture will be a little watery-but don't worry! Add the mixture to the two crusts and place in oven for about 45 minutes.
- Let the pies cool before cutting. Once the pie is at room temperature, top with fresh homemade whipped cream. Enjoy!
